Catholic Charities Guide to Emergency Shelter in Denver



In Denver, Catholic Charities is the largest provider of emergency shelter for single women through Samaritan House, which operates at multiple locations across the city. We also shelter families and veterans, ensuring they have access to safety, dignity and support.



SINGLE WOMEN

- Walk-up access 24/7 unless beds are full.
- Please call ahead to check availability.
- Guests must be able to manage their own Activities of Daily Living (ADLs).
- Service animals only.
- If full, we'll help find a bed at another location.

Samaritan House Lawrence Street - 303-294-0241

- Returning participants must reserve a bed in advance and then return between 3:30 - 5:00PM.
- Walk-up access begins at 5:00PM for those without a reservation.
- Guests must be able to manage ADLs.
- Service animals only.
- If full, we'll help find a bed at another location.

LONGER-TERM SUPPORT: Single women who qualify are encouraged to apply for the Samaritan House Supportive Living Program, which provides comprehensive services to help women move toward stable housing and meaningful work.

FAMILIES

Families needing emergency shelter should call the Salvation Army Connections Center at 303-295-3366. They handle all family intake in Denver and can refer to Catholic Charities and other programs.

Catholic Charities programs that support families include:

- **Samaritan House:** For single-parent households with children under 18.
- **Marisol Homes:** For single mothers with children under 12 or women at any stage of pregnancy.

Both programs work closely with the Salvation Army Connections Center and professional referrals, such as doctors and case managers, to ensure families are placed in the most supportive environments for success.

VETERANS

Veterans are encouraged to go to the Community Resource and Referral Center (CRRC) at 3836 York St., Denver, CO 80205 for referral into Catholic Charities' Veteran Services program. Community - **303-294-5600**

SINGLE MEN

The Denver Rescue Mission Lawrence Street Shelter (1130 Park Ave W, Denver, CO 80205) and Salvation Army Crossroads (1901 29th St, Denver, CO 80216) both provide emergency shelter for single men. - **303-294-5600**

COUPLES WITHOUT CHILDREN

Unfortunately, there are no dedicated couple shelters in Denver, so partners may need to stay in separate facilities. Samaritan House on Lawrence Street is across the street from Denver Rescue Mission Men's Shelter, which may allow couples to remain nearby.
